Minimum order is one bundle (10 or 15 seedlings), and orders need to be per bundle
i.e. 4 bundles White spruce and 3 Siberian larch (for a total of 60 spruce and 30 larch)

PLANTING RESTRICTIONS – PER MD of FAIRVIEW

Information on tree plantings given to MD of Fairview landowners will include the following recommendations:

- Plantings along the roadside must be at least 10 m from the property line (unless otherwise approved).
- Plantings perpendicular to the road must be at least 15 m from the property line.
- If a powerline is close to your planting area, you must stay 15 m away from it if you have trees that will grow in excess of 13 m in height. You may plant shorter shrubs (e.g. lilac, etc.) nearer the lines.
- Landowners should consider the size of their largest implement (and future implements) when planning the layout of the shelterbelt. Make sure that you will have enough room to move equipment freely when the trees are fully grown.
- Exceptions to planting restrictions may be approved by the Agricultural Fieldman on an individual basis.

Cautions for Town and Urban plantings especially:

These trees will provide beauty and fantastic shade some day but be sure to plant them where you'll be grateful to have year-round shade. Lodgepole pine, White & Blue spruce, and Siberian larch should be planted 12 to 15' apart. The willow, poplar and ash should be planted 10' or so apart.

When choosing planting sites keep in mind that these tiny seedlings could grow to become massive trees, Spruce, pine & larch have the potential to grow to 60' in height, 20" in diameter with roots that may extend twice as far as their height. Don't plant these seedlings close to current or future building sites as the roots can ruin foundations and basements.

Keep them away from sidewalks, driveways and boulevards where the branches might pose issues and require trimming. Keep them away from overhead power and phone lines, and don't forget what's underground either, in 15 years will they have to be destroyed because they are ruining the sewer system, or because the gas or water line needs repair?
