Summer has finally arrived after a late spring and it looks like the drought may finally be over. Along with the rains some road damage occurred which could be expensive to repair.

This years' budget is as tight as we have seen it in the last seven years. Due to a loss in assessment, council had to increase the mill rate to try and make up for the shortfall.

Once again we are continuing our road reconstruction program; however we have tendered out approximately 4 km on each side of the Burnt River Bridge which was slated for replacement in 2013. There will have to be an emergency repair done on it this year. The public works crews will also be busy gravelling, maintaining and replacing culverts and approaches.

The spraying program, as well as mowing of the ditches is also continuing.

Council and staff are committed to providing the best services we can provide our ratepayers as economically as possible.

FAIRVIEW DISTRICT FARMERS SCHOLARSHIP

The Fairview District Farmers have established a scholarship fund from which annual awards will be made to selected applicants who satisfy the established criteria. The Fairview District Farmers' Scholarship is designed to encourage local rural students to pursue further education, by providing funding assistance. It is intended to assist students whose parents (or family) can give little or no support to help them attend a post-secondary institution.

GUIDELINES

A. In order to be eligible for consideration, an applicant must be:

- Son or daughter of a farmer, who derives the majority of their livelihood from farming in the MD of Fairview and is considered a bona fide farmer by the Selection Committee.
- A graduate of the Fairview High School, St. Thomas More School or have successfully completed home schooling.
- Continuing his or her education at a university or other post secondary educational institution.

B. A maximum of two awards may be given annually.

- Award applicants must have a minimum of 65% average in four core subjects.
- The applicant's statement for consideration will be used to determine the student's need for assistance. The student will be required to provide a statement for the Selection Committee indicating why they should be considered for this award. They must include a brief description of their family's farm operation, their leadership activities within their school and community, their future career goals, and their vision of the future of agriculture in Canada.
