# **COUNCILLOR CONCERNS**

### Road Tour Sites

Little Burnt Coulee: Still needs some work; Public Works will be placing more cement up the side walls.

TWP 810 intersections of RR24 & RR23: Work will be completed to mitigate future flooding over the roadway.

TWP 814 between RR11 and RR12: Larger culvert is being installed and work is being done on the base of the road.

RR14 between TWP 812 and TWP 814: Ditch has been cleaned to alleviate flooding during spring runoff.

RR31 between TWP 814 and 812: Water is flooding a nearby yard during the spring runoff; there is a buried culvert nearby and cleaning the culvert may alleviate or worsen the problem.

RR35 between TWP 824 and TWP 830: Work will be completed some time this summer to install new culverts and deepen the ditch. Rebuilding the road in this area would take a minimum of three weeks to one month, using dirt from a nearby borrow pit. There are two natural water runs in this location, so while it will be mitigated, the problem will never be fully resolved, even with a road rebuilding.

RR51 Realignment: Update provided in the CAO's report.

Ski Hill Road: The barricades near the slide location are being moved or otherwise blown over. Two lanes of traffic can continue to flow through that general area. There is more room there to create a thoroughfare, in the event of further sliding.

Walsh's Corner: The road realignment will occur in 2022. The detailed design will be completed in 2021. In the meantime, there is signage posted and barricades in place in the area.

TWP 824, west of RR44: There is water running over the road (beavers in the area exacerbate the problem). The bridge may be compromised if the issue is not addressed. The landowners' permission will need to be obtained.

# Other Councillor Concerns:

Councillor Kolodychuk mentioned that the signage (4' x 8') entering into Bluesky is no longer upright (as is the school sign).

## DIRECTOR, PUBLIC WORKS REPORT

Kevin Morrison, Director, Public Works, presented his report to Council.

In addition to the report, the Director, Public Works indicated that a ratepayer in Bluesky had expressed his concern that his vehicle has been sprayed during the application of dust control. The ratepayer had spent a large amount of time detailing his vehicle.

In the future, it may be beneficial to advise ratepayers in advance of the dates that dust control will be applied.
